## Past continuous (I was doing)

Study this example situation:



Yesterday Karen and Jim played tennis. They began at 10 o'clock and finished at 11.30.

So, at 10.30 they were playing tennis.

They were playing = they were in the middle of playing. They had not finished playing.

Was/were -ing is the past continuous:

I/he/she/it was we/you/they were

playing doing working etc.

I was doing something = I was in the middle of doing something at a certain time. The action or В situation had already started before this time, but had not finished:

I started doing	I was doing	I finished doing

Compare the past continuous (I was doing) and past simple (I did):

Past continuous (in the middle of an action) Past simple (complete action) □ I walked home after the party last night. □ I was walking home when I met Dave. (= all the way, completely) (in the middle of an action) ☐ Kate watched television a lot when she ☐ Kate was watching television when was ill last year. we arrived.

- We often use the past simple and the past continuous together to say that something happened in the middle of something else:
  - ☐ Matt phoned while we were having dinner.
  - □ It was raining when I got up.
  - □ I saw you in the park yesterday. You were sitting on the grass and reading a book.
  - ☐ I hurt my back while I was working in the garden.

But we use the past simple to say that one thing happened after another:

□ I was walking along the road when I saw Dave. So I stopped, and we had a chat.

## Compare:


- □ When Karen arrived, we were having dinner. (= we had already started before she arrived)
- □ When Karen arrived, we had dinner. (= Karen arrived, and then we had dinner)
- Some verbs (for example, know and want) are not normally used in the continuous (see Unit 4A):
  - □ We were good friends. We knew each other well. (not We were knowing)
  - □ I was enjoying the party, but Chris wanted to go home. (not was wanting)
